Oregon Tech Athletics Recap from 2016-17 Seasons

- 2016 season was the first winning season in OIT Men's soccer history as the Owls finished with a final record of 9-8-2 while also marking the first time the program made the CCC post season.
- Oregon Tech Volleyball finished with a record of 12-14 under 1st year Head Coach Andrew Clifton, just missing the CCC post season conference tournament.
- Both Cross Country Teams finished with the highest ranking in school history as the women finished ranked No. 8 nationally and the men finished at No. 19. Cross Country also had two All-Americans.
- Both men and women's basketball teams had stellar years as the women made the National Tournament for the 4th year in a row and finished with a record of 24-9.
- The Hustlin' Owls finished with a record of 24-10. The men hosted the CCC Championship game for the first time since 2012, also qualifying for the National Tournament for the first time since 2012.


Oregon Tech Athletics Recap from 2016-17 Seasons

- Golf women dominated the Cascade Conference, winning both the regular season and the CCC Championship Tournament on the way to a 15th place finish at the NAIA National Tournament, making their first appearance in school history.
- Men's golf was led by Montana Frame who won the CCC Tournament and finished 30th at the National Tournament, garnering a NAIA 2nd Team All- American Honor, the first ever in school history.
- The Lady Owls Softball team finished 2nd in the regular season and lost in the Championship game of the NAIA opening round regional and finished ranked No. 26 nationally.
- Baseball made the NAIA West Playoffs for the first time in 4 years, finishing the season with a record of 18-29 with Head Coach Matt Miles picking up his 200th win as a head coach (All at OIT).
- Track and Field had strong years with six student-athletes competing in the NAIA National Championships and Seth Gretz earning his third All-American Honor in the Multi Events.

Oregon Tech Athletics Recap from the start of 2017-18 Seasons

Board of Trustees

- The Men's Soccer program finished the season with an 8-8-1 record and 7-5 in conference.
- The Women's Soccer team had their best conference season in program history, finishing in 3rd place with an 8-3 conference record.
- Both Men's and Women's Cross Country teams had a stellar Fall each earning a 10th place finish at Nationals. Three athletes were named NAIA All-American.
- Volleyball had a much improved season, losing many close matches and finished with a 10-15 overall record.




TECH LEADS CCC IN ACADEMIC HONORS

AVERAGE GPA









Graduation GPA





Retention of Athletes vs Non-Athletes




