** Student placements are guided to ensure students graduate with a diverse clinical experience while also accounting for student choice of location. While OIT/OHSU DPT program does not *require* students to attend a clinical experience which the students would be required to seek alternative housing or travel accommodations, it is likely that students will elect to attend clinicals outside the immediate area. In addition, there are not sufficient clinical opportunities in the immediate area to accommodate an entire cohort of students. It is highly likely that most of our students will need to seek alternative housing or travel during one or more of the clinical experiences while attending the OIT/OHSU DPT program.
